


# Exodus

## Part 1: The Cry That Began A Revolution

*Use these questions to help guide your conversation as a community, or individually to help as you reflect on what God has been saying to you.*



Exodus means 'the road out of'. It's an event and story with deep resonance both for Israel and the Christian tradition. It's also a journey from death to life that gets told from one generation to another.

### Questions to Consider:

- What is your understanding of the Exodus event? Why do you think it is important for Christian faith?
- How do you understand the doctrine of providence? Where do you see this belief played out in the Scriptures and in your own life?
- How significant is the fact that it was a cry of pain and an act of defiance that starts the Exodus story?
- What aspects of our culture need to be resisted today? Why do you think this is? What do you think it looks like?
- What would deeper prayer look like in your life and among your community?

### Practice:

*Pray the words of Psalm 40:1-3. Allow God to lead you as you pray these words for your own life.*


I waited patiently for the Lord;
